

Riding

We hold over 400 club events annually, ranging from local rides and meetings to a week long national rally. Some rides are for bikes of specific eras or specific manufacture, but most rides are simply for the pleasure of riding a bicycle or tricycle with friends.

Researching

We publish nine magazines a year, which cover both cycle history and club activities. 'News & Views' focuses on current events, and 'The Boneshaker' records aspects of cycling history. We have a library of over 10,000 cycling related documents available for members to reference, and there is a rolling programme to make these available on-line to members. We have access to specialists who can help with specific aspects of cycling history and machines. The club is associated with the John Pinkerton Memorial Publishing Fund, which publishes new and reprinted books with historic cycle interest. The club sells a wide range of historical cycling publications.

Restoring

Club members receive our annual directory of suppliers, so together with classified adverts in the magazine, and club meetings, a club member should be able to obtain that rare machine or hard to find part. We have designated experts on specific manufacturers and types of cycle, but also many members have expertise and experience, and are happy to help with projects.

Most of our members enjoy all the activities of the club – many enjoy riding their restored cycles in good company, and researching their cycle's history.
